**One-Year Visiting professor for Cultural Studies of the Middle East (01.10.2018-31.08.2019)**

Cultural diversity and deep historic ties have shaped the societies of the Middle East to the present day. This Master's programme adopts an interdisciplinary and transcultural approach that considers the *Kulturraum* of the Middle Eastern in its entirety, including both its Islamic mainstream but also more peripheral groups.

The appointee will be expected to actively contribute to the academic and intellectual life of the Master's programme. Demonstrated excellence in teaching and research in the broad spectrum of Oriental Studies is desired.

The relevant qualifications consist of a completed academic degree, pedagogical aptitude, a particular talent for academic work generally substantiated by the quality of a doctorate, and, in addition to this, further academic achievements.

Applicants are asked to submit:

- (a) a brief (maximum 1000 words) statement describing your research and the reasons why our Master's Programme would be a fitting setting for you to conduct your research and teaching;
- (b) a Curriculum Vitae including list of publications and teaching experience, and
- (c) a proposal on a selected interdisciplinary topic for the English language module 'Theory and Methods', to be conducted in the summer semester 2019.

The Faculty is an equal opportunity employer and encourages applications from female candidates. Where candidates are otherwise equally qualified, preference will be given to candidates with disabilities.
