What is the ERASMUS+ program?

The Erasmus+ Programme is a European funding programme established in 1987 offering university students a possibility of studying abroad in another [European country](#) for a maximum period [12 months](#) per cycle of studies.

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Who can benefit?

Higher education students from after completing a 1st year of studies can benefit of the Erasmus+ programme. There is no age limitation.

What about the funds?

Each student receives a **grant** which covers partly the costs of the stay abroad. Grants differ from sending and host countries (you can just ask the International office). The grant can often be complemented by regional or national grants.

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Students going on exchange under the ERASMUS+ programme [pay the tuition fees at their home university](#).

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Universities very often offer language course for international students.

For [master students](#) in most cases a good knowledge of the English language (B1 level) is enough.
