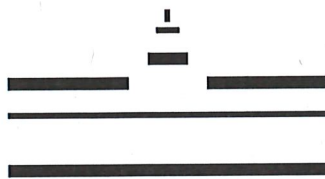

## **ACADEMIC COOPERATION AGREEMENT**

**BETWEEN**

**UNIVERSITÀ DEGLI STUDI DI TORINO**

**Law Department**

**AND**

**UNIVERSITY OF MÜNSTER**

**Faculty of Law**

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**establishing a structured mobility programme for students' exchange leading  
to a double degree consisting of the Postgraduate Degree in European Legal  
Studies (LM-90)  
and the Master Degree in German Law (LL.M.)**

**Having regard to** the Italian Ministerial Decrees DM 509/99 and DM 270/04 allowing Italian Higher Education Institutions to develop joint study programmes with other Italian and non-Italian institutions;

**Having regard to** the Ministerial Decree of 14 October 2021 No. 1154 "Self-assessment, Evaluation, Initial and Periodic Accreditation of Places and Courses of Study" as amended or added;

**Having regard to** the Decree No. 2711 of 22 November 2021 on the definition of the contents, operation and deadlines for the compilation of the *SUA-CdS* database for the initial accreditation of courses of study from the 2022-2023 academic year;

**Considering** that the structured mobility programme for students' exchange leading to the double degree is accredited by the Italian Ministry of Education;

**Considering** that the acquired second cycle degree gives access to third cycle studies.

## THE PARTIES

AND

University of Münster (Faculty of Law), represented by Rector Prof. Dr. Johannes Wessels, on the other

AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

### 1. Purpose and general provisions

1.1. Università degli studi di Torino (UniTO), Department of Law, and University of Münster (, Faculty of Law, agree to cooperate for realising a structured mobility programme for students' exchange leading to the double degree in:

- For UniTO students:

***5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01) (UniTO)***  
***and***  
***Master Degree in German Law (LL.M.) (University of Münster)***

- For University of Münster students:

***Postgraduate Degree in Law (Abschluss Erste staatliche Prüfung) (University of Münster)***  
***and***  
***Postgraduate Degree in European Legal Studies (LM-90) (UniTO)***

The parties will jointly define in a technical annex modules, seminars, exams and related credits of the joint programme, as well as any other useful technical detail.

1.2. Students of both institutions can opt for further studies in order to obtain professional qualifications that enable the practice of law in the respective partner country:

- For UniTO students:

***Postgraduate Degree in Law (Abschluss Erste staatliche Prüfung) (University of Münster)***

- For University of Münster students:

***5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01) (UniTO)***

The parties will jointly define in a technical annex modules, seminars, exams and related credits, which need to be obtained beyond those of the double degree programme in order to achieve these degrees.

- 1.3. Both parties appoint a contact person who leads the joint integrated study programme at the respective faculty and is responsible for its implementation. The current contact persons are:

- 1.4. Students that complete the study programme successfully, including the compulsory mobility period, will obtain two national degrees, one from each of the two institutions. In addition, each student will receive two separate diploma supplements that detail the participant's academic programme and the academic achievements for each degree.
- 1.5. It is the responsibility of the students, participating in this programme, to supply both faculties with all the necessary information and personal details, such as transcripts of grades, diplomas etc., needed for the process of admission, study and graduation. The faculties will not exchange student details, unless explicitly requested for by the student him/herself.
- 1.6. Students involved in the structured mobility programme are enrolled in both institutions for the time of the mobility programme. Both institutions involved guarantee participants access to the courses and the awarding of the final diploma, if all necessary credits were obtained. The UniTO will recognize courses and examinations attended by the student at the University of Münster in order to obtain the Postgraduate Degree.
- 1.7. Students will attend part of their degree course at the UniTO and part at the University of Münster according to the attached technical annex and the regulations in force in each institution. At the end of the structured mobility programme, participants will write a final dissertation/thesis/Master's Thesis to be followed by an oral defense as planned in the technical annex.

- 1.8. Students taking part in the mobility programme are subject to the rules and norms in force at the host institution. All students enrolled in the mobility programme will receive the same services offered to students enrolled in ordinary study programmes at both institutions involved. The parties will provide students with any useful information in order to assist their stay during the mobility period. Costs related to expatriation procedures, accommodation and living expenses will be at the expense of the students, unless otherwise agreed.
- 1.9. Relating to the Italian side, the Board for the relevant degree course shall manage all the administrative tasks (concerning the integrated study plan, the recognition of credits awarded and the conclusion of the student's career), in accordance with the provisions of the art. 22 of the Università di Torino Statute approved by the Rector's Decree D.R. n. 1730 – March, 15, 2012. Relating to the German side, the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Law shall manage the administrative tasks.

## **2. Provisions for students at the Faculty of Law at University of Münster to obtain the Postgraduate Degree in European Legal Studies from UniTO**

- 2.1. University of Münster will select the students who will attend the international mobility programme on their part. University of Münster will select the participants through a call within the three semesters preceding the beginning of the mobility. The double degree programme starts in winter semesters.
- 2.2. Students willing to join the structured mobility programme must have attended at least 6 semesters of law studies before the mobility. Students will also have to prove a good knowledge of the English language (at least B2 level in the Common European Framework of Reference, CEFR).
- 2.3. University of Münster is responsible for verifying that outgoing students have completed the required studies, as well as all the requirements mentioned in the call, in order to attend the study programme at the UniTO.

## **3. Provisions for students at UniTO Department of Law to obtain the LL.M. Deutsches Recht from University of Münster**

- 3.1. UniTO will select the students who will attend the international mobility programme on their part. UniTO will start the participants' selection process by publishing a call within the semester preceding the beginning of the mobility. The double degree programme starts in winter and summer semesters.
- 3.2. Students willing to join the structured mobility programme must have attended at least 6 semesters of law studies before the mobility. The students must have obtained a 5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01) before applying and enrolling for the third semester at University of Münster. All ECTS credits for the degree must be completed at the time of application (March 15 for summer semesters and September 15 for winter semesters). If the students at this

moment did not yet receive their certificate, they will instead for the application hand in a certification from UniTO stating that they will be awarded the academic degree of „Laurea Magistrale” and will receive their certificate within 6 months after enrolling at University of Münster. They will need to hand in their certificate no later than 6 months after enrolling at University of Münster.

3.3. Students will also have to prove a good knowledge of the German language (B2 level in the Common European Framework of Reference, CEFR for the first 2 semesters and C1 level for the third semester) proven by an official certificate accepted by the University of Münster.

3.4. UniTO is responsible for verifying that outgoing students have completed the required studies, as well as all the requirements mentioned in the call, in order to attend the study programme at the University of Münster. Italian students without a completed a 5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01) cannot be enrolled in the Master Degree Programme in German Law (LL.M.) and, therefore, cannot complete the double degree.

#### **4. Financial management of the structured mobility programme, fees and ancillary contribution**

4.1. The institutions commit to find, if necessary, the financial resources in order to achieve the abovementioned purposes. Both parties agree that all financial obligations should be negotiated in advance and will depend on funding availability. Financial burden related to the activities covered by this cooperation agreement will be charged on the department directly involved in the initiative, unless otherwise agreed.

4.2. Students are exempt from paying enrolment fees at the Host Institution and must pay fees exclusively at the Home Institution. Nevertheless, ancillary contribution (such as social service contributions), whether it is required by internal regulations, is due for the total extent of the degree course at the Host Institution.

#### **5. Insurance coverage**

5.1. Each person involved in the activities set out in this agreement must be covered by an insurance for civil liability.

5.2. Both parties provide insurance coverage for accidents connected to institutional activities and duties previously authorized, in accordance with internal existing regulations, and carried out inside the university premises or third parties' premises.

5.3. Under no circumstances shall either party be liable for any loss, damage, costs or expenses of any nature in relation to (i) indirect, special or consequential losses; or (ii) any loss of profits (whether direct or indirect) or goodwill which arises directly or indirectly from that party's breach or non-performance of this agreement, or negligence in the performance of this agreement or from any liability arising in any other way out of this agreement. For the avoidance of doubt, nothing in this agreement excludes any liability for death or personal injury, liability for fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation or any other liability, which cannot be excluded by law.

- 5.4. This agreement does not provide coverage for medical and health costs. The students will be required to have full medical insurance coverage and third-party liability insurance for the duration of their stay in the host country and must bear the related costs. The insurance must include medical evacuation and repatriation.

## **6. Quality assurance of the degree course**

The institutions commit to guarantee the quality of the mobility programme according to their national standards.

As for UniTO, the degree course is subject to quality assurance national regulations according to the standards of the National Agency for the Evaluation of the University and Research Systems (ANVUR) for self-evaluation, evaluation and accreditation.

As for University of Münster, the degree course is subject to quality assurance national regulations according to the standards of the Foundation Accreditation Council for self-evaluation, evaluation and accreditation.

## **7. Dispute resolutions**

Any conflict that may arise between the signing Institutions regarding interpretation, non-validity, execution, modification or termination of this agreement will be settled amicably and by negotiation.

If the parties cannot achieve an agreed solution, the dispute should be submitted to the unappealable decision of an arbitration committee. This will be appointed ad hoc and it will be composed of at least three members. Each party will appoint one of the members; these, in turn, will appoint by mutual agreement a third member acting as president.

## **8. Duration, modification and renewal**

- 8.1. This agreement shall come into effect in the academic year 2023/2024 and is valid for 5 years. It may be modified by mutual discussion and written consent of both parties and may be terminated by either party. The agreement will terminate six months after the written notice of such intent. In case of termination, the parties agree to honour the terms of this agreement for students whose participation in the double degree programme has been approved by both faculties prior to the termination, as if the agreement remained in force for the period of their integrated programme.

- 8.2. This agreement can be renewed for an equal period by mutual written approval of the institutions at least three months before the termination date

- 8.3. Any modification or updating of the technical annex can also be agreed after the signing of this agreement according to the regulations in force at the moment of the mobility.

## **9. Final provisions**

- 9.1. The respective regulations for the UniTO's and the University of Münster's Master programmes in the version currently valid are part of this agreement. If it was not agreed upon a matter in this agreement, the parties will fall back upon these regulations.
- 9.2. This agreement is written in the English as well as Italian language. In case of uncertainty about the content, the English language version shall prevail. Any notice given under or in connection with this agreement will only be effective if it is in the English language.

## **10. Drafting and signature**

This agreement, written in English and Italian, is signed in two equivalent texts per language. Each Institution will keep at least one copy in each language.

### **Programme Structure:**

A limited number of students can participate in the programme:  
10 per year from Torino  
10 per year from Münster

The double degree has the following structure:

- UniTO students will be enrolled at the University of Münster for two semesters as exchange students ("Austauschstudierende") and will attend the courses specified below obtaining 60 ECTS credits. After the completion of the 5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01) in Torino and a sufficient application to the University of Münster, they will be enrolled in the Master in German Law (LL.M.) to attend the last module ("Abschlussmodul") including the Master's Thesis and an oral examination (30 ECTS credits);
- University of Münster students will be enrolled at the UniTO for two semesters and will attend the courses specified below obtaining 42 ECTS credits. After the completion of the first state exam (Erste staatliche Prüfung), the students will attend the final dissertation/tesi (18 ECTS credits).

**Degree Structure:**

The institutions, in order to award the double-degree:

- regarding students enrolled at the home institution, are required to specify the correspondence between exams/credits obtained from partner university and exams/credits from the home degree course programme in the mobility year/period;
- regarding students enrolled at the partner institution, are required to detail activities and correspondence of the exams/credits obtained in the mobility/period and during the whole degree course

The activities detailed by both UniTO and University of Münster may vary according to the academic offer of the relevant academic year.

**University of Münster students** must have attended at least 6 semesters of law studies before the mobility and will have to prove a good knowledge of the English language (at least B2 level in the Common European Framework of Reference, CEFR).

During their stay in Torino they will attend 42 ECTS credits:

**UniTO students** must be enrolled in the 5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01) at UniTO and will have to prove a good knowledge of the German language (B2 level in the Common European Framework of Reference, CEFR for the first 2 semesters and C1 level for the third semester), proven by an official certificate accepted by the University of Münster.

During their first two semesters in Münster they will attend 60 ECTS credits, which will be recognized after the enrolment to the Master in German Law (LL.M.) in the third semester:



After having completed the *Basismodul*, the students choose one of three fields of law for the *Erweiterungsmodul I, II and III*: (1) Zivilrecht, (2) Öffentliches Recht or (3) Strafrecht; and one of eight profiles for the *Profilmodul*: (1) Wirtschaft und Unternehmen, (2) Arbeit und Soziales, (3) Informations- Telekommunikations- und Medienrecht, (4) Internationales Recht, Europäisches Recht und Internationales Privatrecht, (5) Rechtsgestaltung und Streitbeilegung, (6) Öffentliches Recht, (7) Kriminalwissenschaft or (8) Steuerrecht. The regulations for the WWU's LL.M. degree programme include detailed module descriptions, which are part of this agreement.

After the completion of the 60 ECTS credits and the completion of the 5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01) at UniTO they will be enrolled in the Master in German Law (LL.M.) and will be admitted to attend the last module: "Abschlussmodul" (30 ECTS credits):

### **Final dissertation/Tesi/Master's Thesis**

After completion of the programme of international mobility, the Italian students are required to write a final dissertation/tesi/Master's Thesis under the supervision of a member of the academic staff either from UniTO or University of Münster. If the final dissertation/tesi/Master's Thesis is written at UniTO, it needs to be comparative in nature and must correspond to the courses completed at the University of Münster. It will be recognized at the University of Münster after the enrolment in the Master in German Law (LL.M.).

The German students are required to write a final dissertation/tesi under the supervision of a member of the academic staff from UniTO.

The final dissertation/Master's Thesis/tesi will be discussed through an oral examination in the institution supervising the final dissertation/Master's Thesis/tesi. In case of Italian students doing their oral examination at UniTO, the oral examination will be recognized at the University of Münster after the enrolment in the Master in German Law (LL.M.) and there will be no additional oral examination at the University of Münster.

The final dissertation/Master's Thesis/tesi will be written in one of the languages of the partner institutions (as agreed with each student) and discussed in the same language.

## Programme Regulations

### Entry Requirements

- A. As for students from UniTO: they must have attended at least 6 semesters of law studies before the mobility and will have to prove a good knowledge of the German language (at least B2 level in the Common European Framework of Reference, CEFR for the first 2 semesters and C1 level for the third semester).
- B. As for students from University of Münster: they must have attended at least 6 semesters of law studies before the mobility and will have to prove a good knowledge of the English language (at least B2 level in the Common European Framework of Reference, CEFR).

### Programme requirements

In order to award the degrees, the following credits must be acquired according to the terms of the Didactic Regulation of the Degree Course, as stated by the University Didactic Rules:

For University of Münster students: Postgraduate Degree in Law (Erste Prüfung) and Postgraduate Degree in European Legal Studies (LM-90), 120 ECTS credits (in italian: CFU).

For UniTO students: 5-year Postgraduate Degree in Law (LMG-01), 300 ECTS credits (in italian: CFU) and Master Degree in German Law (LL.M.), 90 ECTS credits (in italian: CFU).

Recognition of UniTO grades of German students at University of Münster are decided at a case-by-case basis and are therefore subject to changes of the conversion key.

For the recognition of UniTO grades of Italian students at University of Münster, the predicted grades are generally used. If the students can proof that they belong to the percentage necessary for a specific grade, the grade will be transferred and recognized using the conversion key of proofed percentage.

For the recognition of University of Münster grades of both students, the predicted grades will be used at UniTO.

### **Final provision**

For WWW Münster students interested in obtaining the 5-year postgraduate degree in Law, after the completion of this double degree program, UniTO could transfer the credits earned in order to admit them with career shortening, upon resolution of the Department Board. The credit transfer will be done according to the current rules of the one-cycle degree program in Law (LMG/01).
