Armin Wandrewala is a lawyer and author and practices as a Counsel in the Bombay High Court, and occasionally also in other High Courts in India, and in the Supreme Court of India, as also Tribunals like the National Company Law Tribunal/s, and the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal. She has published three books till date: *The Turning, Alone ... In the Valley of the Gods,* and *Not Just Legally Speaking. The Turning* has also been published in German, by Ullstein. Armin was also the first Indian author to be invited for the *Criminale*, an international festival for crime fiction fans, held in Berlin, at which she read from her book in German, a language of which she has a working knowledge. She has also given readings and talks in India and abroad. Armin is the first Indian to be interviewed by 'Deadline', a Swedish Radio Programme dedicated to crime fiction. She has been awarded the 'Excellence in Literature' by the Bombay Parsee Association.

<u>Klaus Stierstorfer</u> is Chair of British Studies and Vice Dean of Philology at Muenster University, Germany. He studied English and Theology at Regensburg University and at the University of Oxford. He received his D.Phil. from Oxford University. He has served as Vice President and as President of the Deutscher Anglistenverband, on the Board of ESSE and on the International Committee of IAUPE. He has held a Christensen Fellowship at St Catherine's College, Oxford, and he is a corresponding Fellow of the English Association. He has published widely on British, Colonial and some Postcolonial Literature. He was director of the EU-funded, Marie-Skłodovska-Curie Initial Training Programme CoHaB, Co-Director of the Europa-Kolleg in Muenster, director of the graduate training programme "Literary Form" funded by the German Research Council and he is Spokesperson of the "Collaborative Law and Literature Research Centre", SFB 1385, at the WW University of Muenster.
