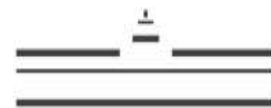

Prakash Shah works at Queen Mary University of London as a Reader in Culture and Law. He has an interest in several interlocking fields of law, culture, religion, caste, and migration. He is currently researching the complications, within and outside the legal domain, of articulating the position of Indian emigrants and their descendants abroad, especially in the UK.

Janet Wilson is Emeritus Professor in English and Postcolonial Studies at the University of Northampton, UK. Among her current research interests is writing on and about refugees and asylum seekers, and the white settler societies of New Zealand and Australia, in particular the transnational writing of their diasporas. She is editor-in-chief of the *Journal of Postcolonial Writing* and co-editor of the series, *Studies in World Literature* (Ibidem-Verlag).



Nilufer E. Bharucha is Director, CoHaB Indian Diaspora Centre and Visiting Professor in Humanities, CEBS at the University of Mumbai. She is Faculty Associate Emeritus at the SASI, UFV, Canada, and Global Faculty, Fairleigh Dickinson University, USA. She has published widely in the areas of Postcolonial Literature, the Writing of the Parsis and Diasporic Literature & Cinema. She is also a translator and creative writer and has been on the jury for literature awards in India and abroad. She is co-editor of CoHaB IDC's *Diaspora Studies Series*.

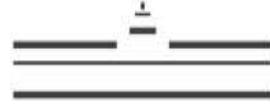
