Project Title: Exploring The ‘Abortion Road Trip’ in American Young Adult Fiction

My current project explores literary and cultural representations of teen pregnancy and abortion in contemporary American Young Adult (YA) texts, situating these representations within the rapidly changing, unstable, and increasingly conservative sociopolitical environment in America. By combining textual analysis of three novels (*Unpregnant* by Jenni Hendricks and Ted Caplan [2019]; *Girls on the Verge* by Sharon Biggs Waller [2019]; and *Plan A* by Deb Caletti [2023]) with real-life data, this research takes an interdisciplinary approach to examine what I term the ‘abortion road trip’ – a journey undertaken by a young female protagonist to access abortion care. The research conducted during this fellowship will lay the groundwork for a future book project entitled *Beyond the Problem Novel: Representing Teen Pregnancy, Abortion and Parenthood in Twenty-First Century American YA Fiction*.

2024: Library and Information Officer, Belfast Metropolitan College, Belfast, Northern Ireland

I provided research support to students and faculty across a diverse range of disciplines within the Arts and Humanities, IT, and vocational qualifications such as Motor Vehicle and Sports Massage. I also developed and lead the “Library Explorers” initiative. This project aimed to increase the confidence of students aged 14-16 from Special Schools in Northern Ireland in engaging with library services. Library Explorers also encouraged these students to read for pleasure, consequently complementing their academic growth, increasing overall literacy, and fostering a culture of lifelong learning.

2019–2024: Occasional Lecturer and Tutor, School of English, Drama and Film, University College Dublin, Ireland

I designed, delivered, and convened two undergraduate courses: a third year seminar, ‘Girlhood in Twenty-First-Century American YA’ and a first year elective course, ‘Banned in the USA: Banned, Challenged and Controversial YA Fiction in America’. I also lectured and taught on the team-taught second year survey modules, ‘Modern American Literature’ and ‘Philosophy and Literature’.

2018–2023: Government of Ireland Postgraduate Scholar

Thesis Title: “If people were rain, I was drizzle and she was a hurricane.”: An Exploration of the Manic Pixie Dream Girl in Contemporary American Young Adult Literature.

My doctoral thesis takes an interdisciplinary approach to understand how the Manic Pixie Dream Girl (MPDG) trope manifests across contemporary American YA literature, media, and culture. I argue that the seemingly-quirky Pixie is a hyperfeminine cultural steam valve who merely masquerades as difference while reinforcing the norm -- a character designed as an object of patriarchal fantasy and who, to paraphrase film critic Nathan Rabin, simply disappears once her work is done.

My project was fully funded by a nationally-competitive Irish Research Council Government of Ireland Postgraduate Scholarship. I am one of a handful of recipients in the field of Children’s and Young Adult Literature since the award’s establishment in 1999.

a) Course Coordinator

2024: Banned in the USA: Banned, Challenged, and Controversial YA Fiction in America (Stage One)

- Designed, implemented, and coordinated the course, an elective which explores book banning in the United States since the turn of the twenty-first century. The module asks why these books are banned and by whom, discusses the complicated relationship between prizewinning and banned books, and examines the cultural shift from challenging books to challenging authors.
- Prepared and delivered weekly one-hour lectures to 50 undergraduate students from across the University (majors included English, History, and Electronic Engineering).
- Designed and assessed innovative student assignments including a reflective response assignment and a report or presentation in which students plan events for Banned Books Week.

2021–2024 Girlhood in Twenty-First-Century American Young Adult Fiction (Stage Three)

- Designed, implemented, and coordinated the course, which explores conceptualisations of girlhood across a range of YA fiction published in the United States between 2005 and 2021.
- Prepared and delivered seminars to over 50 Stage Three undergraduates across this period.
