This also raises the imporant questions whether e.g. ethnic, gender, national and regional identities can be traced to an essence, how these different 'types' of identities might intersect, and how these questions are dealt with in literature.



The conference is organized by students and seeks to offer a platform for Bachelor, Master and Magister students of all fields of study to present their research and to exchange and discuss their work and ideas with peers sharing a similar interest in English Literary and Cultural Studies.
