

Module III.1 Interdisciplinary Perspectives: Exchange & Transformation (10 LP)

The aim of the Interdisciplinary Perspectives: Exchange and Transformation module is for students to benefit from the productiveness of interdisciplinary work for their own research projects. The overlapping of English literature and cultural studies, English linguistics, and book studies offers a theoretical and practical expansion of explicitly interdisciplinary perspectives.

The module consists of one seminar and one lecture. In the seminar, starting points for interdisciplinary concepts are designed on the basis of specific subject-specific topics and debates, while the lecture contextualizes and concretizes overarching interdisciplinary discourses. The combination of seminar and lecture thus serves the purpose of identifying, discussing and deepening interdisciplinary aspects and research questions that result from the seminars of the three sub-disciplines of book studies, linguistics, and literary and cultural studies.

Seminar (6 LP)

As part of the seminar, students are expected to complete a **4,500-word term paper** for an overall module grade.

Lecture (4 LP)

In the lecture, students complete **task sheets** for course credit. The number of task sheets will be defined in the first session of the lecture.

* *Dual Master's Degree*: Dual MA BAPS/MEd Gym/Ges students are able to reduce the number of their written assignments by writing a single term paper for both BAPS and MEd credit in the field of literary studies, book studies, or linguistics. In this case, the longer of the two assignment lengths must always be used.
