Bradford E. Hinze received his doctoral degree in theology at The University of Chicago and his Masters Degree in theology at Catholic University of America, Washington DC.



He has served as the president of the Catholic Theological Society of America, The College Theology Society, and The International Network of Societies for Catholic Theology. For the past ten years he has been on the faculty at Fordham University and prior to for almost twenty years he was on the faculty of Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. His areas of concentration are fundamental and systematic theology with a special concentration in ecclesiology, hermeneutics and critical theory, and political theology.

He has published three books, *Narrating History, Developing Doctrine: Friedrich Schleiermacher and Johann Sebastian Drey* (1993); *Practices of Dialogue in the Roman Catholic Church: Aims and Obstacles, Lessons and Laments* (2006); and

Prophetic Obedience: Ecclesiology for a Dialogical Church (2016). He has edited and co-edited five books, including the most recent volume with Peter Phan, *Learning from All the Faithful: A Contemporary Theology of the Sensus Fidei* (2016); and with Anthony Godzieba, *Beyond Dogmatism and Innocence: Hermeneutics, Critique, and Catholic Theology* (2017).
