Colloquia on the History of Origen's Reception

The "Colloquia on the History of Origen's Reception", which take place annually at Münster University, focus upon the eventful reception history or *Nachleben* of the Origenian metaphysics of freedom and, in particular, its significance in the shaping of the modern concept of man.



I. The "Cambridge Origenists"

The time between 1658 and 1662 may rightly be termed an Origenist moment within English theology. It produced editions and translations of Origen's writings as well as entire philosophical systems informed by his metaphysical genius. Not only is the work by the Anglican bishop George Rust (published anonymously in 1661) the first defence of key Origenian doctrines, but a daring manifesto of early modern Origenism at that: Critically taking stock both of the new philosophies of Thomas Hobbes and René Descartes and the theology of Calvinism, the author expounds basic insights of Origen's freedom metaphysics in the light of the crucial controversies and epoch-making changes of his day.
