"Running in order to stand still: the challenges facing feminists in times of radical political and cultural change"

Tina Beattie first encountered feminism when she moved from Harare in Zimbabwe to Bristol in England with her husband and four small children in 1988. She has navigated a complex intellectual path through feminist theology, gender theory, psychoanalytic theory and art, while also developing a keen interest in women's sexual and reproductive health and rights. All this constitutes an endeavour to track the elusive presence of the female body in theology and culture, discovering that this "body" undergoes repeated metamorphoses as different theories, theologies and cultural authors/authorities lay claim to its significance. If feminists are to retain the fragile gains made for women against the rising threats posed by new cultural and political movements across the western democracies and further afield, they must run hard in order to stand still - in order not to lose the ground already gained.
