[18.10.2022] **Radio interview with Prof. Treib in Deutschlandfunk Kultur**

Prof. Treib was interviewed in a radio show of Deutschlandfunk Kultur on the power relations within the German coalition government. He argued that the decision to extend the use of the three remaining nuclear power plants over the winter represented a classical compromise between three coalition partners with divergent policy preferences. The decision presented by Scholz as a matter of his authority as chancellor was very likely the result of an informal deal between the leaders of all three coalition partners. Prof. Treib speculated that invoking the formal power of the chancellor to set the government's policy guidelines on this issue served the purpose of sidelining the opponents of the decision within the Green party. [14.09.2020] New open access article in Research & Politics about mainstream Euroscepticism

To what extent do centre-right parties make Eurosceptic claims and in how far do these claims borrow from the established Eurosceptic discourse of the radical right? In a freshly published article in *Research & Politics*, Prof. Treib explores this question by analysing the 2014 and 2019 European Election manifestos of centre-right and radical right parties in Austria, France, Germany and the Netherlands. The analysis suggests that there is such a thing as mainstream Euroscepticism: centre-right parties do make a significant amount of Eurosceptic claims, but they do not draw to a significant extent on the existing discourse of radical right parties. Instead, they predominantly create their own Eurosceptic claims, which are tailor-made to their entrenched programmatic brands.

[08.06.2020] New Article in Global Environmental Politics on measuring the quality of life

Which way forward in measuring the quality of life? This question is addressed in a new article in *Global Environmental Politics*, co-authored by Prof. Treib in collaboration with Doris Fuchs, Bernd Schlipphak, Le Anh Nguyen Long and Markus Lederer. The article analyses a range of widely used indicator sets seeking to establish which countries of the world have the highest quality of life. The analysis finds that very few of these indicator sets offer an encompassing view of all relevant aspects: economic, social and political dimensions of well-being as well as different dimensions of sustainable development. Moreover, the findings reveal a clear trade-off between well-being and sustainability: Nations that rank high on well-being have a low score on sustainability and vice versa.

[16.03.2020] New Article in Journal of European Public Policy about Euroscepticism and cleavage theory

In the 2019 European Parliament elections, Eurosceptic parties were able to consolidate their strong results from 2014. Based on a revised conceptualization of Euroscepticism, this article by Prof. Treib provides an overview of the Eurosceptic vote and argues that Eurosceptic parties have by now established themselves as a fixed part of the EU party system. He argues that Euroscepticism is the result of an emerging centre-periphery cleavage in EU politics. This perspective sees Euroscepticism as a reaction to the process of centre-formation at the European level, as a way of defending the specific cultural, economic and regulatory traditions of member states against the process of centralization of authority at the European level since the 1950s.

The Conference aims to bring together citizens from all over Europe, civil society and the European institutions in order to reflect on the future of the Union and give new impetus to the European project.

In a [radio interview that was broadcast today in the WDR5 show "Politikum"](#) (in German), Prof. Treib discusses whether the controversial debates about the Euro and the Eurozone rescue packages, which were very much in the focus of media attention during the Eurozone crisis, are a thing of the past. He argues that these issues are currently not high on the political agenda but could easily make a comeback if external events such as a potential crisis in Italy or a critical ruling of the German Constitutional Court on the European Central Bank's bonds purchasing programme take place. In this case, he expects the populist radical right Alternative for Germany to revive its critical political agitation against the Euro, which is currently overshadowed by the party's focus on anti-immigration issues.

In an article that was just published in *European Union Politics*, Bernd Schlipphak and I analyze data on the selection of committee leadership positions in 2014. We show that the selection process is not about party group loyalty or relative party size but about MEPs' individual career ambitions and their relevant parliamentary experience.

[29.06.2018] Radio Interview with Prof. Treib on the national party convention of AfD

In a [radio interview that was broadcast in the WDR5 show "Morgenecho"](#) (in German), Prof. Treib talks about the current status of Germany's right-wing extremist party Alternative for Germany (AfD) and its future prospects. He argues that the party, which holds its national convention in Augsburg this weekend, has meanwhile established itself in the German party system and is a force to be reckoned with in the future. At the same time, the party draws on a limited voter base. He thus considers it highly unlikely that Germany will see an AfD chancellor in the foreseeable future. In the context of local protests against the AfD convention, he warns against violent conflicts since these can be used by the party to present itself as a victim of left-wing violence.

Prof. Treib will be on research sabbatical leave during the summer term 2018. From April to June, he will join the Department of Public Administration of Radboud University Nijmegen as a visiting researcher.

[19.01.2018] New Publication on Representation Gap between German Parties and Citizens on European Integration

Prof. Treib shows in a recent book chapter that German parties do not represent the EU-related views of citizens very well. While more and more citizens have come to view the EU with increasing scepticism, most German parties have remained staunch supporters of European integration. This representation gap was not a major problem as long as citizens paid little attention to EU affairs. This changed, however, with the onset of the European debt crisis, which pushed EU issues on the political agenda. Since then, more and more citizens look out for parties that offer Eurosceptic or at least Europragmatic programmes. But the established parties at the centre of the political spectrum do not offer such programmes. As a consequence of this representation gap, Eurosceptic citizens either abstain from voting in elections or opt for (left or right-wing) extremist parties with Eurosceptic agendas. The establishment of the Eurosceptic and right-wing extremist "Alternative for Germany" in the context of the European debt crisis has to be seen against this background.

[21.12.2017] New Publication on the Politicization of EU Membership in the UK

Why did a majority of British voters decide to leave the EU? In a new book chapter, Prof. Treib analyzes the politicization of EU membership in the UK. He shows that the process of politicization was driven by conflicts over Europe within and between political parties, which spilled over to the broader public as a result of party mobilization and the extensive coverage of the EU issue in the Eurosceptic yellow press. These processes gave rise to a deep rift over EU membership, which divided all strata of British society and ultimately led up to the Brexit vote in June 2016.

Derartige "Living Reviews" wurden Ende der 1990er Jahre zuerst in den Naturwissenschaften etabliert, um der scientific community stets aktuelle Beiträge zum Stand der Forschung in bestimmten Bereichen zur Verfügung zu stellen. Mit den "Living Reviews in European Governance" kam 2006 erstmals auch eine sozialwissenschaftliche Reihe hinzu. Die Living Reviews erscheinen online als frei zugängliche Open-Access-Zeitschriften und unterliegen einem strengen Peer-Review-Verfahren. Prof. Treibs Living Review befasst sich mit einem äußerst dynamischen Feld der EU-Forschung. Das gerade erschienene Major Update ist um 13 Textseiten länger und umfasst 80 Literatureinträge mehr als die letzte Version:
