

Brigitte Young is Professor Emerita of International Political Economy, Department of Political Science at the University of Münster, Germany. She previously served as Expert Advisor to the Enquete-Commission of the German Parliament on 'Globalization of the World Economy.' She is currently a member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the EU-financed project on 'Financialisation, Economy, Society and Sustainable Development (FESSUD) and an Expert Advisor to the EU-Project on 'Orchestrating Information Technologies and Global Systems Science for Policy Design and Regulation' (SYMPHONY). Young has held several guest professorships at the Free University, Berlin; Science-Politique, Paris; Science-Politique Lille; France; Central European University, Budapest, Hungary; Warwick University UK; and Georgetown University, Washington, D.C., USA.
