German language courses are organized by a special unit of Muenster University, devoted to teaching faculty and students from abroad. This center is called WipDaF.

You will find a placement test, information on fees, registration forms and further information. Please look for the dates and levels that are most convenient for you.

In addition to the WipDaf German courses (you may, but do not need to take one if you just want to participate in the classics' part), we will offer a series of special venues for participants to learn and practice German. Lessons will be focused on people dealing with classical scholarship. Every week, there will be classes hosted by graduates and faculty of the department of classics. Classes will offer guided reading of articles or book chapters, discuss recent research, or training of regular vocabulary.

Accommodation: WipDaf may offer help with finding an accommodation, you will find information on conditions and costs on the site mentioned above. Furthermore, there are the usual opportunities online, newspapers, and sim. If you need assistance on how to find opportunities, please contact us. Costs for a room may be around 400 Euro per month.

Further costs: Apart from rent etc., the general fee for Classics & German will be 80 Euros.

Dates and Application

The core program will take place from 4th of June until 6th of July. You are welcome to arrive earlier or stay longer, but note that special events will be limited to the period indicated above. Most regular



courses will end by 20th of July.

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

The Program

The German courses are taught by professional and experienced staff with special expertise in teaching students from an academic environment. The Classics' part is run by faculty of the department of classics, ancient history, medieval and byzantine studies. Participants get access to regular courses in the BA, MA and PhD curriculum, colloquia, venues and postdoc-events. Access will be facilitated by introductory sessions and additional material for G&C participants in order to follow easily the regular curriculum.

Libraries in Muenster are among the country's largest and best equipped in



the field of classics. Join a vivid community, meet fellow students and colleagues, and take part in the academic life of Muenster.
