The five-day module will give interested master students the opportunity:

- to broaden their knowledge on current issues and tools in international nature conservation,
- to receive first-hand information and discuss with those actively involved, and
- to create a platform for networking and information exchange.

The module will contribute to qualify master students for future work in international conservation organisations and for scientific tasks related to international nature conservation.

Content and structure

The module will cover the following topics (subject to minor changes):

- Biodiversity trends and conservation approaches
- Protected areas
- IUCN Red List
- Strategic conservation planning
- International governance framework for biodiversity conservation
- International negotiations within multilateral conventions
- Marine nature conservation
- Social aspects of conservation

It will take place from Monday to Friday while Sunday and Saturday are travelling days. You will experience a didactical mix of lectures, interactive discussions, role plays and training units including working groups. The language will be English.

Crediting

Each participant has to prepare an assigned contribution (e.g. delivering a presentation, taking a role in a simulation game or preparing a case study) and do further assignments. You need to allocate about 40 hours for preparation of these tasks. About 50 hours are envisaged for the participation in the module on the Isle of Vilm. Please be prepared for long working days, but be sure to be rewarded with a life-time experience.

The module is offered as facultative module, elective module or mandatory module within your Master's programmes. Credits will be issued based on 90 hours by the respective universities according to their rules. Please contact your Master's programme coordinator for details.

Costs

There are no costs for the board and lodging. Only the travel costs have to be paid by the participants themselves.
