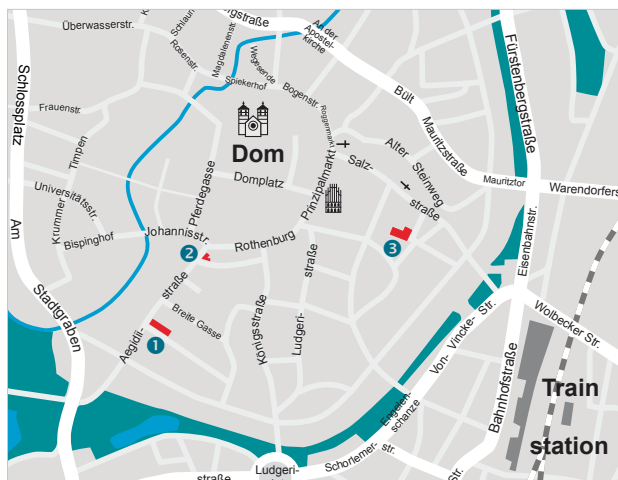

## > Outline

Within the framework of Collaborative Research Centre / Sonderforschungsbereich 1150 “Kulturen des Entscheidens”, subproject A02 investigates the development of scholastic discourses and practices of decision-making as well as the social and institutional environments in which they were embedded.

The main focus lies on

- > Interactions between academic practices and theoretical concepts of decision-making
- > Influence of academic concepts and practices on extra-academic procedures of decision-making
- > Decisions and conflict groups

The workshop’s aim is to identify relevant questions within this field of research. Therefore, we focus on a specific historical situation in which several aspects particularly important for our research can be found. As starting point, the workshop concentrates on intra- and extra-academic lines of conflict and their interferences in the environment of the Parisian university (c. 1300).
