

STIBET-Scholarship sponsored by the DAAD

Students taking part in the university partnership exchange can apply for a STIBET-scholarship. The scholarship is meant to support students from abroad to finance their additional living expenses in Germany.

Duration of the scholarship will be a minimum of four, a maximum of ten months, depending on the duration of the student's stay at the University of Münster. Usually, the funding period at the WWU is 4 months. The monthly scholarship rate is 300 Euro.

Sponsoring body is the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), a German association, mainly funded by the German Federal Foreign Office. Its members are German institutions of higher education and student bodies.

Documents needed for the scholarship application (download at: <https://www.uni-muenster.de/InternationalOffice/en/formulare.html>):

- Completed STIBET-scholarship form (form online available)
- Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- A short letter of motivation (1 page) indicating the student's motivation to study at the University of Münster, the student's preparations and study plans for the stay in Germany
- An overview of academic records from the home university
- A German or English language certificate (only applicable for non-native speakers)

Documents are to be written either in English or in German.

At the end of the exchange period, students who received a STIBET- scholarship have to hand in a short evaluation report (1-2 pages) about their stay. Deadlines for the application are: **28th of February** (for the summer term) and **31st of August** (for the winter term) each year.

Applicants will get a definitive answer about their application at the end of March (semester April- September) or end of September (semester October-February).
