

DAAD-Prize 2023

For international students of WWU Münster

The DAAD Prize is a distinction of foreign students* for social commitment and outstanding achievements. The prize is endowed with 1,000 euros. The award recognizes foreign students who have distinguished themselves through special academic achievements and remarkable social or cross-cultural engagement.

The candidate should be in the advanced stage of the Bachelor (at least 2nd or 3rd year of study) or Master's degree (at least 2nd semester), engage in socio-social work and provide good academic performance. In addition, young graduates (that is, the degree is no longer than 3 months ago) and doctoral candidates may be nominated.

The prize is not a research prize and is not intended for scientific appraisal of a doctoral thesis. It can not be awarded to exchange students nor to students with a High School Diploma obtained in Germany.

It is not possible to apply for the DAAD Prize. Candidates must be nominated by a professor. If you believe you meet the award criteria, please contact your professor and see if she/he would like to nominate you.

For a nomination, the following documents must be submitted by 31 July 2023:

1. Nomination letter from a professor
2. Curriculum vitae of the candidate
3. Copies of the candidate's academic achievements
4. Proof of social or intercultural commitment
5. Recommendation letter from another institution or person, such as the student council, the AStA, a study programme coordinator, ...
6. Copy of the candidate's residence permit (in case of EU citizens: copy of passport or ID card)
