



Open and Relational Theology and its Social and Political Implications Muslim and Christian Perspectives

It is no coincidence that it is precisely in the 20th century that various explicitly relational philosophies and theologies are breaking out. Never before have people been more aware of how highly interconnected their lives are, how interdependent they are economically and ecologically, politically, psychologically and socially – and also how fragile this complex balance is in which our civilization moves. The Corona pandemic, the Russian war, and the worsening climate crisis have once again shown us this in all urgency in the past years.

To take this integration into larger contexts seriously and to consider it philosophically and theologically is one of the basic concerns of Alfred N. Whitehead's process philosophy, and then especially of John Cobb's process theology. Since then, process thinking has been characterized by a high level of interest in issues of social justice, political engagement, and environmental ethics.

Contemporary Islamic theological approaches inspired by the philosophy of freedom or the theology of process reveal very similar concerns – and Open Theism as an evangelical awakening movement also fits into this motif, insofar as it claims not only to shape individual piety but also to promote the public responsibility and influence of human beings.

The online conference "Open and Relational Theology and its Social and Political Implications: Muslim and Christian Perspectives" takes place in the light of this topical background. It asks about the potentials of a relational and "open" theology in both religious traditions to empower people and to grant them social and political self-efficacy:









- ▶ What does an "open" or relational theology bear out in a time of pandemics, war, and climate crisis?
- ▶ Where are the peace-promoting and democracy-building potentials of an "open" or relational theology and where its dangers?
- ▶ What are the connections between theology (and more narrowly: the image of God) and social/political engagement?

Participants include Gregory Boyd and John Sanders, two thought leaders of Open Theism, and prominent figures in process theology Thomas Jay Oord, Catherine Keller, and (via video message) John B. Cobb. In the Islamic tradition, Mouhanad Khorchide, Saida Mirsadri, Jared Morningstar and Adis Duderija, among others, will present keynote addresses on Muslim perspectives on the field of "Open and Relational Theology".
